A Message from St Andrew's

Apparently C.H. Lawrence said that the world fears a new experience more than anything else. Ideas are not a problem, "The world can pigeonhole any idea. They are easily discounted and dodged". But an authentic inner experience is more difficult to discount. Experience changes us, for good or ill, we can't go back to the way we were before.

God invites us to experience him, not just to think about him or even to pray to him or seek to please him, but to know him as one might know a friend or relative - to experience his presence in our lives.

One of the most life transforming experiences that I have had is the sense that he has been with me in my suffering.

This isn't simply an idea that is helpful – though it is a helpful idea to know that God is not indifferent to the suffering of people on earth, but that he came and shared in it through his suffering and death.

But through faith this can be much more than idea, it can be a healing experience.


Isaiah, a prophet who wrote more than 500 years before Jesus was born, wrote about the death that Jesus was to go through. You can find it in Isaiah Chapter 53:

He was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain.

Like one from whom people hide their faces he was despised, and we held him in low esteem.

Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted.

But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our



iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed.

He shares in the sense of inadequacy and shame that we so often feel through our limitations. But he does more - he takes upon himself our pain, he bears our suffering, he takes upon himself the punishment - the consequences of our failings, or as Isaiah puts it - our transgressions and iniquities.

An experience of this leaves us feeling free, feeling loved and adequate, feeling forgiven and whole. It is a very great gift. An experience that is life changing.

We will be looking together at Isaiah chapter 53 during our midday Good Friday service and giving God the opportunity to come to us anew so that we can experience the peace of sins forgiven, wounds healed, and shame lifted.

You would be most welcome if you are able to join us. Have a wonderful Easter.

Jason Cunningham

First of all congratulations go to Pete and Babs Ray who correctly named Luke Campbell who won the prestigious boxing gold medal in the London Olympics in 2012.

This ensured ringside seats for them at Doncaster's Dome Arena when Jason took to the ring there on Saturday March 4th. He met Jamie Speight over 10 rounds at the Featherweight limit of nine stones. From the beginning Jason seemed sharp and very confident and by the halfway stage looked virtually unassailable. It was about then that he injured his left hand which allowed his opponent to stage a

minor comeback in the final few rounds. At the finish, Jason was announced as the winner by 98 points to 94, giving him six rounds to his opponent's two with a further two drawn. It was one of his best performances and his supporters went home very pleased. Now we move onto the main event which finds Jason pitted against veteran Ben Jones at London's York Hall in Bethnal Green on Saturday April 8th. This will be a 12 round Featherweight contest at nine stones for the Commonwealth title. Jones, who comes from Crawley, is 34, and has won 22 out of 28 fights. Provided Jason reproduces his form from his previous fight we confidently predict him to win this title, possibly with an inside the distance victory. Tickets are now available at £60 ringside, £35 standard. The doors are expected to open at 6pm with Jason's fight likely to take place at around 9pm. OUR FARMING YEAR

The Speirs family has farmed in the Slip End area since 1933 having originally arrived from Ayrshire to take on Newlands Farm on the Luton Hoo estate.

A milking herd of British Friesians was run from Newlands Farm together with arable cropping in the fields surrounding the farm and up to the eastern edge of Slip End village. In 1984 the herd of milking cattle was amalgamated with a second herd at Pepsal End Farm and although all milking took place at Pepperstock the buildings at both farms housed cattle.

In 2011 we went out of dairy and currently we have a pedigree Hereford beef suckler herd of cattle on our farms. With our Hereford cows calving from December to the end of March we look forward to turn out when each cow with a calf at foot will be put out to grass for the summer months.

The bulls will join the cows for four months. On the arable side we currently grow wheat,

beans, barley and oats.

Oilseed rape has been a crop grown for many years but in this area the cabbage stem flea beetle and pigeons are devouring this crop and we feel it is no longer viable to grow it successfully. We are often asked what we are growing in the fields surrounding the village and this year the field directly behind Summer Street is growing oats which once harvested will be sold for human consumption and will be used as an ingredient in muesli bars and breakfast cereals.

In March as the weather continues to improve we race to get the spring drilling (sowing) in the ground - planting malting barley and beans.

The first application of nitrogen fertilizer is also spread on the crops that were sown in the autumn. This gives the crops nutrients so that as the soil warms up the crop can grow rapidly.

Exciting new developments at Slip End Village School

It has been an incredibly exciting and busy time at Slip End Village School during the last few months as our school site has undergone extensive works to improve both its internal and external facilities.

Following becoming a primary school and expanding our age range to cater for pupils from three to 11 years of age, the school required an additional classroom space to meet its growing numbers. The new classroom is now nearing completion and will provide a multifunctional learning environment which will be suitably equipped for teaching subjects such as Science and Art. It truly is a wonderful space and we are all looking forward to using it. Another change to the school site has been the addition of a new car park at the front of the school enabling car parking for five more vehicles. Through the installation of cycle pods we are also encouraging more pupils to cycle and scoot to school thereby alleviating parking congestion on Rossway and our surrounding roads. During December, the school took part in the charity Sustrans 'Santa Challenge' which proved to be a very successful 'Walk to School' initiative; one of our pupils, pictured above, won a bike donated by the charity which promotes journeys to school by foot, bike, scooter or public transport.

We continually work hard to teach our children to be safe on their journeys to and from school. This however is also the responsibility of the whole community and once again we would like to remind everyone to avoid parking outside school.

Illegal parking causes obstruction to the school site, hinders the view of pupils and other pedestrians crossing the road and is disrespectful to residents.

The Slip End Village Hall car park is available for parking; this would not only relieve congestion but also add a few minutes healthy exercise to the start of the day. Traffic wardens do now visit Rossway and ticket illegally parked cars as necessary.

As the daylight hours become longer and the weather becomes sunnier we look forward to more people enjoying their walking, scooting and cycling to school.

LUTON HOO ESTATE WALLED GARDEN



Spring has sprung and we start the season with a Spring Open Day and Plant Heritage Fair at the Luton Hoo Estate Walled Garden on Saturday 22nd April 2017 from 11am-3pm. Entrance is just £3 (under 5 years old free) and tours of the garden can also be taken for an extra £2. Free children's activities will be on offer and tea, coffee and cake can be purchased as well as those all important plants.

The tours really give an insight into this volunteer-led garden revival and our emphasis this year is looking at the progress made since the beginning of the project in 2001. Research was carried out initially and the gardening did not start until 2007. The garden is constantly evolving and this winter our gardeners and conservationists have spent many hours removing the plastic

Gardening Tips by Russell Sprout

At time of writing we are still getting a lot of wet weather which is making it difficult to get on in the garden, hopefully by the time you are reading this it will have dried up a bit.

There is still time to repair impoverished lawns this month, a light mowing followed by scarifying and then aerate to improve drainage.

Over-seed any bad areas and rake in well, apply a spring fertiliser and level any bumps or hollows. Complete pruning of roses as soon as possible and apply fertilizer at approximately a handful to the square yard, but leave a six inch circle around the actual plant itself, and hoe into the surface.

After a good downpour mulch around the plants with a one inch layer of manure or bark chippings to hold moisture. Re-plant any alpines which lack vigour, or which have been lifted slightly out of the ground. Dig the ground and apply a general fertilizer after lifting these plants. Rhododendrons and azaleas can be transplanted if they need moving or complete planting of any new bushes (water newly planted bushes if weather is dry). Remove dead heads of early flowering varieties.

Dahlias started in boxes can be divided with a sharp knife, making sure that cutting has a bud or shoot on it.

Many border annuals can be sown directly into the soil this month to provide a good display of colour and help to suppress weeds.

Carry on planting gladioli for a succession of flowers. Carnations and pinks will benefit from an application of fertilizer to established plants, border plants should be planted by the middle of the month, tall growing varieties can be staked with twiggy sticks pushed into the soil so that the stems can grow up through them.

Sweet peas sown in the spring can be planted out as soon as they are growing strongly. Divide any large clumps of herbaceous plants that are unsightly and replant the outer strongest shoots discarding the middle weaker ones. Keep an eye on fruit trees and bushes as they start to blossom and take action against pests and diseases.

Tomato plants can be planted in a cool greenhouse now and sow seeds indoors for outdoor tomatoes to plant out when danger of frosts has passed. Sow melons and cucumbers in a propagator, prick out as soon as they are large enough to handle. Mulch beds and borders when they have warmed up, after destroying weeds with a hoe and making sure ground is moist. Ensure tender plants are protected from frost.

Plant onion sets in shallow drills and just cover the tops to stop birds pulling them out. Salad crops can be sown as soon as the soil is dry enough to work into a fine tilth but sow little and often, every 2-3 weeks so that you get a continuous supply of crops such as lettuce, radish, spring onion and beetroot and harvest as soon as they are large enough to eat. don't wait to get large woody ones. Carrots can be planted this month, main crop can be sown the middle of next month, sow seeds of late summer cauliflowers and wrinkled seeded varieties of peas which will be ready for picking in approximately 12 weeks. Sow winter cabbages for planting out in June and set out summer cabbages sown last month. As early potatoes start to shoot from the middle of the month protect the leaves from frost either by drawing the soil over them or cover them with straw or newspaper.

There are changes to subsidised bus services to be introduced across Central Bedfordshire from the beginning of May 2017. In 2016 Central Bedfordshire Council consulted on its Passenger Transport Strategy and a key topic was the subsiding of bus routes. Currently 53% of bus services in Central Bedfordshire are subsidised at a cost to the tax payer of £1.2m per year so whilst they understand the importance of having bus services, they need these services to be efficient and cost effective.

Subsidies will now only be allocated to buses running before 6:30pm on weekdays, and before 3:00pm on Saturdays. No subsidies will be available for services operating on Sundays and bank holidays. Bus providers will have the option of continuing to run services outside of these times, but they will no longer be subsidised by Central Bedfordshire. Additionally,

Central Bedfordshire is introducing a number of new bus services to ensure that local residents can access nearby towns.

These changes do not apply to routes funded from Section 106 monies, or to services operated on a commercial basis, with no subsidy from Central Bedfordshire.

The new route 232 will be introduced at the beginning of May. This route will serve the Pepperstock, Slip End and Woodside areas and the service will be provided by South Beds Dial-a-Ride. It will run as a completely normal bus service to a fixed timetable, with no need to be a dial-a-ride member and concessionary bus passes will be accepted.

Information about changes to services will be displayed on buses and at bus stops, as well as on the Central Bedfordshire website.






