# Message from St Andrew's

The Christmas story is full of journeys. And this is reflected in many of the carols and readings that we hear in the run up to Christmas Day. This was taken a bit far when I was young with alternative lyrics, which are probably still doing the rounds now: "We three kings of Orient are

One in a taxi, one in a car,

One on a scooter, beeping his hooter, Smoking a fat cigar!"

Seriously though, there is the journey when Joseph and Mary travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem to register in the Roman census. A group of shepherds, outcasts of their day, are told to journey from the hills down into the town of Bethlehem to find the baby Jesus, lying in a manger. On a separate journey, wise men set out on an epic journey from somewhere in the East (Babylon near modern Baghdad?) guided by a star until it stopped over the place that Jesus lay. Later warned that King Herod was planning to kill male babies, Joseph and Mary left their homeland and travelled hundreds of miles to Egypt until it was safe to return home to Nazareth.

The greatest journey of all is the one that Jesus undergoes in being born! As a Christmas carol says "He came down to earth from heaven who is God and Lord of all...With the poor, the mean and lowly lived on earth our Saviour holy." 1 That was a life changing moment for all humanity. It is the moment where God intervenes in history: "And God showed his love for us by sending his only Son into the world, so that we might have life through him." (1 John 4:9) But it doesn't stop there as a piece of ancient history about a little baby, does it? What does it mean in practice in our lives? Another refrain of Christmas carols is that God is with us. God is with us in whatever situations we find ourselves this Christmas. whether we are stressing at fitting 20 plus members of family around the table and feeding them, or sighing at the thought of Christmas alone. God is with us - we need only turn to him and ask him to walk with us. At St Andrew's we will be offering a resource called #GODwithUs: Your Christmas

Journey. It is a small booklet that can be popped in your bag or pocket so that whenever you can grab a moment of peace and quiet – not easy I know – you can go on a Christmas journey leading closer to Jesus, whose birth we celebrate in this "most wonderful time of the year."

We are holding a number of carol services at St Andrew's in addition to the 10.30 a.m. Sunday services, and we warmly invite you to come along to all or any of them. Details are elsewhere in this magazine. Don't feel reticent if you haven't been to church for a while. We are here as YOUR Parish Church and you are always welcome.

# **OUR FARMING YEAR**

Angela Speirs of J Speirs & Son, Pepsal End Farm, provides a monthly insight into agricultural life

Beautiful weather in October and little rain has made the sowing of next year's crops a relatively simple task with all crops being sown by the end of October. Having recently visited relations in Scotland we count ourselves very lucky that we haven't had the appalling weather that they have experienced this year. We saw in early November that they still had acres of spring barley lying unharvested and ruined in their fields. This summer's catchy weather during the harvesting period has made our malting barley tricky to market. Malting barley is subjected to four main tests: moisture, germination, nitrogen and grain size. As a result of the continual rain during harvest the germination which has to be 98% is proving to be variable. This has led to a number of rejected loads particularly in a

variety we grow for Budweiser beer. These loads are then redirected and downgraded and used as animal feed. The discrepancy may be only 2-5% but it makes the whole process of growing malting barley quite difficult as there is around £30 per tonne difference between full specification grain and substandard. So far only about 50% of our barley has gone on the full specification contracts.

Our cattle are gradually being brought in from the grass fields, cows and calves separated in readiness for the cows to have their next calf in December, January or February.

The suckled calves are now big enough to be weaned from their mothers and although a noisy few days are endured it is essential that all the mothers have a rest before their next labour.

# **Jason Cunningham latest**

Jason strode from his corner at Bethnal Green's York Hall on Friday October 13 looking cool, calm and confident that the defence of his Commonwealth Featherweight title would achieve a successful outcome.

His opponent Reece Belotti from Watford possessed an impressive record of finishing a good number of his fights inside the distance, and was a clear favourite with the bookmakers. He also enjoyed the support of most people present, who packed out the East End arena. However, from the word go it was the man from Doncaster who was catching the attention. Jason was using the ring stylishly and his varied array of punches were a delight to watch. Indeed, by the end of Round 4 Belotti's nose provided ample evidence of the amount of punishment it had taken. The Yorkshireman continued to dominate matters in the early part of

the 5th but Belotti's attacks were

becoming more difficult to quell now, when out of the blue he delivered a vicious right hook just before the round ended. It hit its target and really hurt Cunningham, who fell to the canvas and only just managed to beat the customary count of 10. Jason rose from his stool for Round 6 ready to continue if clearly shaken, but the referee intervened after 40 seconds had passed. He raised Belotti's hand and declared him the winner and new Commonwealth champ.

Cunningham's supporters simply could not believe their eyes. For four rounds they had watched their man deliver a sustained and succulent boxing lesson of the highest calibre which had the word "class" written all over it.

Now one solitary punch had managed to sever Jason's defences and cost him both the fight and his title. It was a high price to pay for a momentary lapse and he will rue the way it happened for a long time. Rest assured that this talented boxer will bounce back and soon as well. The latest news is that he will be competing shortly at the Super Bantamweight 8 stone 10 rounds level, and seeking awards there. We wish him well and will be reporting his undoubted progress and success in the near future.

# Mrs Eleanor Lucy Larsen (nee Hough)

9<sup>th</sup> March 1929 – 19<sup>th</sup> September 2017

Eleanor Larsen of The Grove, Woodside Park, died on 19<sup>th</sup> September, having lived in the Slip End area for the past 35 years. Eleanor was born on 9<sup>th</sup> March 1929 in Abbey Road, Bermondsey, London, and was the second of two children. Her brother Albert was approximately 18 months older.

Eleanor and her brother were not evacuated during the Second World War and stayed in London throughout the Blitz.

When Eleanor left school at the age of 17 she started work at Crosse & Blackwell's, which was based close to her home.

She subsequently worked at Readers Digest, where she met her future husband John P Larsen, a handsome Danish gentleman, and they were married in 1953. Eleanor and John had four children, John (1954), Alan (1956), Kay (1960) and Jill (1962). Eleanor and John moved to Woodside Park in 1983.

They soon became involved in the local community and volunteered at Whipsnade Zoo and with Meals on Wheels until the death of John in 1997.

Eleanor was also a member of the local Women's Institute and helped out making tea/coffee for the toddlers club. In later years she went to Aquaerobics, was a member of the Carpet Bowls Club and enjoyed Line Dancing.

Eleanor's funeral service and

cremation took place on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> October at The Luton Crematorium, The Vale, Luton. The chapel was full of her friends and family and many attendees joined the family afterwards at the Wake, which was held in the Plough at Woodside. Eleanor is survived by her four children.

# Gardening Tips by Russell Sprout

It's nearly Christmas again and as usual I am still trying to figure out where the year has gone! Not helped by waiting for the summer which never happened. There has to be something in global warming, we just don't get the seasons like we used to.

Damp leading to botrytis/mildew is the major problem in the greenhouse, so ventilate on dry days and reduce any watering to the absolute minimum. Lag outdoor taps and drain hoses and spray guns until dry to prevent frost damage. If we have heavy falls of snow this winter knock the snow off the branches of trees and shrubs to prevent them from breaking under the weight of the snow. If you haven't done so already clean and lubricate mowers before putting away for the winter.

Prune climbing roses now, cutting away diseased or damaged growth and tie in any new shoots to their support. Prune older flowered side shoots back by two thirds of their length.

Start to winter prune your wisteria, cutting back summer side shoots to two or three buds. Leave the faded flower heads on your hydrangeas until the

spring, they will provide frost protection to the swelling buds further down the stems.

Remove fallen leaves from alpines and rockeries, fork over between plants with a hand fork and remove weeds. Sweet peas started under glass will require the tips pricking out above the second or third pair of leaves to encourage side shoots to develop before planting out in the spring. Examine dahlia tubers, if shrivelled plunge in tepid water overnight and if any are starting to rot cut off damaged part and dust with flowers of sulphate. Spray fruit trees with a tar-oil winter wash this month or next to kill eggs of pests laid earlier in the year. Tar-oil can be sprayed on all fruit except strawberries. Keep a check for mice damage amongst stored fruit and vegetables and also amongst autumn sown peas and broad beans and take appropriate action.

Recycle as much waste as you can on the compost heap and burn any woody matter that won't break down, but check carefully for hibernating hedgehogs before starting a bonfire.

Nothing to sow or plant so use any leftover compost on the garden, don't be tempted to keep it for next year. Inspect plants & fruit trees to see if any are in need of TLC, such as tying or firming in where they are suffering from wind rock. The seed catalogues are available now but remember, it is first come first served so get that order in as soon as possible. Remember when comparing a modern F1 hybrid against an older open pollinated type that the F1 will always mature in the same week, whereas the open pollinated varieties will crop over several weeks.

Well it's time to wish you all a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year, see you in February.

# **Waste Collection Update**

Kerbside collection of household garden waste will be suspended across Central Bedfordshire over the winter months.

The collections will be suspended from Monday, 4 December 2017 until Friday 2, March 2018 inclusive. This means the last collection in the Parish will have been the week commencing Monday 20th November. The decision to stop the kerbside collection service during the guietest time of the year for garden waste was made as part of the council's financial planning process, and comes as a result of Government funding cuts. Council Tax alone doesn't raise enough to cover all the services the council provides, and so the council focuses on delivering services that meet the periods of high demand, in this case restricting garden waste collections to during the growing season.

# **Sandra's Winter Warmers**

On 17<sup>th</sup> October, I went to NOAH Enterprise with my good friend Sarah Robinson from Caddington (and her children) to deliver all the coats that had kindly been donated by residents of Caddington and Slip End. Sarah's mum, Sandra, who died last year, was a long term supporter of this local charity that helps homeless people and those on the margins of society.

To commemorate the anniversary of her loss, Sarah wanted to do something in honour of her mum and asked NOAH chief executive Jim O'Connor what would be most useful to them. He said that they were in dire need of winter coats, their existing supply having dwindled to just three and the weather

already getting colder. Sarah set up Sandra's Winter Warmers and we appealed to everyone we knew for any spare men's coats, and were delighted and overwhelmed by the response. Sarah had hoped for 100 but we nearly doubled this with over 180 coats collected in just two weeks. We also received many donations of tea, coffee, hot chocolate and biscuits. Every coat was wrapped in cellophane with a sticker and Sarah gave the

hot chocolate and biscuits. Every coat was wrapped in cellophane with a sticker and Sarah gave the charity a card with the names of every person and organisation who had donated. Thinner coats were coupled with body warmers, and fleeces were paired up with waterproof layers. All other donated items were dropped off the following week – this included other menswear items and toiletries kindly donated by local people. Anything that is not suitable for their existing clients will be sold in one of their Luton charity shops and the money raised from that goes to provide services for all the people that visit the hostel every day. On the day we went to deliver the coats they had organised flu jabs and TB testing.

On a day to day basis they provide hot meals, hot drinks, showers, medical care, training and support services. They prepare 40,000 meals per year and in the last 12 months have supported over 600 homeless people just in the Luton area. They also provide a night shelter during the very coldest winter nights.


