HOBBIES

I have always taken an interest in the natural world and over the years, apart from angling (you may remember a previous article in the magazine) I have kept aviaries and several types of fish. I have kept tropical, freshwater and marine fish, and until we moved to Pepperstock, I had a large pond with Koi Carp. My interest in fish led me to try snorkelling when on holiday, and eventually to trying SCUBA Diving (Self Contained Underwater Breathing Apparatus).

Like many people, I had sampled a 'try dive' when on holiday overseas but it had not been successful and I was disappointed that I had not been able to fulfil my dream. Sometime later a friend who dived, suggested I go to their club and try again. I could not believe how different my experience was. A very patient instructor helped me to overcome all my fears and enjoy the sensation of being weightless in water.

I immediately booked a course and qualified as a PADI diver. I passed the theory in England but did the open water dives to complete the qualification, while on holiday. Whilst there, I decided to take the advanced qualification and became an Advanced PADI Open Water Diver. This meant that I could dive to 30 metres instead of 18.

That was it; every holiday was spent scuba diving and as a lover of marine life, I have been in my element ever since. I subsequently qualified as a PADI Rescue Diver and Divermaster, and also joined the local British Sub Aqua Club which meets every Thursday evening to dive in the Inspire Pool in Hitchin Road where we can practise diving between 2 and 5 metres.

I am now an Assistant Instructor for BSAC and most Thursdays I take try dives for people who would like to learn to SCUBA dive but perhaps are nervous, or who would just like to see if they would enjoy it.

Perhaps like me, you had a bad first experience while on holiday and feel disappointed, or would just like to 'give it a go' to experience being able to breathe underwater, I would suggest that you come along and have a try dive one Thursday. Age is no barrier either! I was 56 when I first qualified and my Granddaughter has qualified as a Junior at just 10 years old.

I cannot describe how wonderful it is to be at one amongst some of the most wonderful creatures in our seas, like mantra rays, whale sharks and many beautiful marine fish. I highly recommend giving it a try – see the advert on page 4. Your holiday may never be the same!

Gardening Notes from Russell Sprout

So far we haven't had such a bad winter, although it has been a bit soggy underfoot at times. Let's hope we have had the worst of the really cold weather and can look forward to getting in the garden. If you have any large clumps of snowdrops they can be dug up and split into small bunches and replanted straight away, but this should only be done about every fifth year.

Plant roses early in the month and prune established plants during a frost free period, cutting out all dead wood and any branches crisscrossing to open up and shape the bush to a bowl shape. Don't be afraid of cutting a rose back too far as they benefit from a really good reduction of the previous year's growth to produce strong new shoots. Gladioli corms can be planted later this month and if sown over the next 6 weeks will give a longer flowering season. Sow between 4-6 inches deep and you will avoid the need of staking them. Sweet peas which were sown in autumn and over-wintered in pots or bought from a nursery will need to be planted out as soon as the weather permits. They make an effective display when grown in clumps and supported with pea sticks or a cylinder of netting. Dahlias and chrysanthemums over -wintered in the greenhouse will have shoots on them by now and cuttings can be taken when they are approximately 3 inches long.

Lawns will need some attention after the rigours of winter, new lawns need a final raking of ground dug in the autumn to a fine tilth for sowing seed. Established lawns will benefit from a good scarifying with a lawn rake or an electric scarifier to remove dead grass, moss and thatch. Any worn areas can be reseeded and any sunken areas levelled and seeded to bring it back to a good condition for the year ahead. The first time you cut don't cut too short, lower the blades over the next few mowings. Trim and straighten edges angling the cut slightly away from you to avoid it crumbling away.

Early potatoes can be planted from the middle of the month 9-12 inches deep and 14 inches apart, but as they shoot above ground they will need to be protected from frost. Main crop Brussels sprouts can be sown early in the month in drills ½ inch deep for planting out at the end of April. Parnsips can also go in as soon as the soil is dry in drills ½ inch deep and 15 inches apart, if you sow 3 seeds at 6 inch spacings this will make it a lot easier when it comes to thinning out. Leeks can be sown this month for transplanting in June and summer spinach sown this month will be ready in May/June. Sow early rounded peas and broad beans until mid month. Onion sets can be planted towards the end of the month or early next month, but shallots should be planted as soon as possible if not already done. Tomatoes sown last month under heat will need pricking out now or they will become weak and spindly. Finish pruning established fruit trees and bushes as soon as possible in the month.

The Gardening Club is having its Plant Sale on Saturday 18th May, at the Village Hall, so make a note and go along to buy your bedding plants, perennials and vegetables and you can enjoy a cup of tea and a chat while you are there! There will also be plenty of interesting stalls inside the hall. See you next month.

Parish Council Draws Large Numbers.

The February Parish Council Meeting was particularly well attended, due in no small part to the agenda which included four planning applications which were of concern to local residents.

The first of these concerned the application by *Bell Classics* for the construction of a museum in which cars being processed by their engineers and other models could be displayed. We understand that there would be some public opening hours. The application did not draw any objections and was passed to the Central Bedfordshire Council for consideration.

The owners of *Little Acre* in Half Moon Lane applied to erect a single story building and utility block to replace a mobile home. It was dealt with as above.

The plan for a retirement village off Markyate Road which drew some criticism when first proposed, had been significantly amended following discussions with the CBC planners. All the recommendations made by the planners and the concerns of local residents had been addressed.

No further objections were made and the plan went forward.

The Outline Planning Application for the construction of 20 affordable homes on land north of *30 Woodside Road* was the reason for so many local residents attending.

Letter from Woodside Residents In an untitled letter sent to Parish News, they acknowledge that this is outline planning application and as such does not include any detailed plans. They have concerns that this Green Belt land which has been used for grazing for many years, situated on a steep hill, is subject to bad flooding on Woodside Road and at Aley Green. Drain cleaning is regularly needed. Whilst the entrance to any estate is unknown, the existing opening, if used, would create a staggered, blind busy crossroad and this development would have a disproportionate

impact on the hamlet. They point out that the Neighbourhood Plan does not include any such development.

Further Parish Council Meeting notes The Parish Council meeting discussed other matters including the arrangements for flower baskets on a number of lampposts in the village which is being funded by Bell Classics. Mr Andy Prothero and Cllr Minnighan finalised the choice of posts and arrangements for the watering and care of the displays.

Three companies had submitted plans for the refurbishment of the playground and given ideas of the possible equipment selection.. As reported before the Council will discuss these items with younger members of the community when making their selection.

The Central Beds representative looking at the condition of the verges in Half Moon Lane and the resulting narrowing had, regrettably, looked at the wrong side of the road before coming to the conclusion that nothing was needed. They will revisit the site with Cllr Shaw.

The serious road accident at the junction of Front St, Half Moon Lane and Pepsal End Lane was reported. This was the second accident in two weeks and it was thought necessary to bring the reconstruction of this junction to the attention of planners again.

Next meeting is on Monday 4th March at 7.00pm.




